OUR OBJECTIVES ARE TO:

- Represent members equally and fairly by supporting initiatives and undertaking projects which benefit the fruit and vegetable industry in the Lockyer Valley.
- Employ an Industry Development Officer to contribute to the fruit and vegetable industry in the Lockyer Valley.
- Promote the Lockyer Valley as a premier production area for fruit and vegetables to increase public and government awareness of the significance of vegetable production in the Lockyer.
- Represent the interests of members by presenting a united 'voice' on matters that concern the fruit and vegetable industry in the Lockyer Valley including lobbying government and industry organisations.
- Identify, scope, attract funding and manage pest, disease and varietal research projects required specifically for the Lockyer Valley.
- Identify government and industry grants and programs that may be of interest to vegetable growers in the Lockyer and make these known to members. Assist with applications when required.
- Apply for multi-use permits for chemicals to allow use in 'off-label' applications in response to situations that require such use be permitted.
- Promote the fruit and vegetable industry in the Lockyer on a website, by issuing media releases and by being a single point of contact for the media when they want a spokesperson to respond to questions of significance to the fruit and vegetable industry.
- Re-establish vegetable industry expo and field days in the Lockyer.
- Create opportunities for social gatherings and group educational opportunities and encourage industry stakeholders to get to know each other, as this makes a significant contribution to building resilience against future floods and other external threats. For example:
